Scholarship Requirements:

Founded in 1901, Grambling State University has evolved into a world renowned and highly respected comprehensive Historically Black University, with a long-standing commitment to providing the highest quality education for its students. As “The Place Where Everybody is Somebody,” Grambling State has become legendary in excellence – academically, athletically and in its extracurricular activities. This is proof positive that the vision of our forefathers is still as clear today as it was at the University’s inception.

As a continuation of GSU’s tradition of producing esteemed graduates who are making noteworthy contributions to society, the GUNAA-DC Chapter will award scholarships to facilitate that measure. The scholarships will be awarded on a competitive basis to graduating high school students in the Metropolitan Washington, DC, area. The scholarships are awarded annually on a selective basis to students who have demonstrated academic and extracurricular excellence during their secondary school studies. The evaluation criteria for selection include (1) academic achievement (grade point average, class standing); (2) extracurricular activities; (3) honors and/or awards; and (4) financial need. No one criterion will be used to determine recipients, as the totality of a candidate’s application will be considered. All Metropolitan Washington, DC, area high school students seeking financial assistance to further their education at Grambling State University who meet the above criteria are strongly encouraged to apply.

To be eligible, an applicant must be a graduating senior of a Metropolitan Washington, DC, area high school or secondary school and have either an application pending acceptance or have been accepted to Grambling State University. **All applicants must submit : (1) a completed scholarship application (attached); (2) two letters of recommendation from non-relatives; (3) a transcript of high school or secondary school grades; and (4) an essay that discusses applicant’s personal goals, objectives, need for financial aid, and reason for choosing to matriculate at Grambling State University. The deadline for submission of completed applications is March 31, 2004. Incomplete applications will not be considered.** Selected applicants only will be notified not later than May 10, 2004.
